



NON-TRANSPORTABLE ITEMS

You should transport valuable and irreplaceable items with you rather than on the moving truck. In addition, there are several items that cannot be put on the truck, such as explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives as well as radioactive and other hazardous materials.

Hazardous Materials

Movers cannot accept flammable, corrosive or explosive goods.

Typical examples of items that cannot be moved include:

Other items not recommended for transport on the van include:

-) Firearms
-) Family photos
-) Food in glass jars and perishable foods
-) Prescription drugs needed for immediate use

Transport items of personal importance or sentimental value with you, such as:

-) Cash, Check Books, Credit Cards
-) Collections (e.g., coins)
-) Important personal papers (e.g., deeds, wills)
-) Passports
-) Negotiable papers (e.g., bonds, stocks, certificates)
-) Jewelry, Precious Stones
-) Computer Programs and Documents
-) Moving documents

Electrical and mechanical items, such as but not limited to, computers, printers, copiers, VCRs/DVD players, CD players, stereos, appliances and the like often fail due to normal vibrations. In the absence of external damage, they are not covered by our liability. This is often referred to as Inherent Vice.

Most manufacturers of particle board or ready to assemble furniture suggest these items should not be moved. Once assembled, these articles will not withstand the rigors of transportation. Therefore, it is not possible to guarantee they will arrive in good condition, regardless of how much care is taken.
